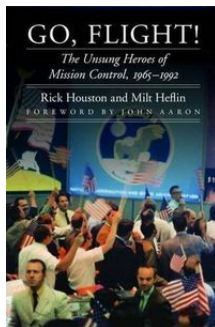


GO, FLIGHT!: THE UNSUNG HEROES OF MISSION CONTROL, 1965-1992
